This interactive morning will inspire you to approach your peers, students and parents in a new way. Sharing new insights and techniques that result in improved understanding, communication and relationships, we will explore the underlying reasons for why kids do what they do and provide positive strategies for managing various behaviours. Throughout the day you will have the chance to question your thinking, entertain new thoughts and gain from others' experiences.


